SYNOPSIS

Breast Cancer is the commonest cancer in women all over the world and it comprises 30 % of all cancer in Malaysia. Our statistics show that 1 in 20 women will develop breast cancer in their lifetime. The age adjusted incidence is about the same in all three ethnic groups in the country.

Conventional treatment of Breast Cancer comprises of triple assessment to confirm the diagnosis, ie, clinical examination, Imaging, (mammogram/ultrasound/MRI), and biopsy. Once the diagnosis of cancer is confirmed. the patient is counselled regarding further management, such as surgery, radiotherapy, chemotherapy and hormonal therapy, if indicated. Following this the patient can opt for traditional treatment for general well being. dietary advice, weight loss, etc. I have many patients coming to see me, referred by traditional medicine practitioners who have advised them to have their cancerous lesions removed before they can start treating them. Most patients accept surgery but are fearful of radiotherapy, chemotherapy and hormonal therapy as they feel the modalities will damage the good cells and make them very sick.
