She also did a two year stint as a Registrar with the Department of Paediatrics of Lister Hospital, Stevenage, United Kingdom from 1996 to 1998.

She started volunteering for NCSM as a Volunteer Medical Officer in 1995. In 2000, she became the Medical Physician at NCSM's Women's Cancer Detection & Breast Clinic. After having held various positions in NCSM as Honorary Secretary of the Selangor Branch, and Executive Director of the Resource & Wellness Centre, she is now the Medical Director and President of NCSM.

As Medical Director, Dr. Saunthari oversees the direction of the operations of NCSM in both the clinical and educational services. This includes ensuring the continuance of current services and establishing new services. On the support front, she actively participates in counselling and talking to individuals with cancer and their caregivers.

She strongly believes that through education, the incidence of cancer in Malaysia can be decreased by raising public awareness about prevention, screening and early detection.
